

Ordinance No. 1966-1

An Ordinance of the Town of Fort Branch concerning the regulation of the parking of vehicles on certain streets and prescribing penalties for the violation thereof and providing methods for the assessment and payment of said penalties.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Fort Branch, Indiana and by said Town acting by and through said Board of Trustees, as follows:

Sec. 1. The parking of vehicles, motor or otherwise, on the streets named below shall be restricted as to time, position and type of vehicle as hereinafter set out:

The parking of vehicles, motor or otherwise, ~~shall be~~ on the North side of Locust Street between McCreary & West Streets shall be limited to one (1) hour on weekdays between 9 A. M. and 5 P. M.

Sec. 2. Other streets and restrictions may be added to this ordinance by the Board from time to time upon resolution adopted at any regular or special meeting.

Sec. 3. The Board may cause appropriate signs indicating such restrictions to be erected so as to inform the public of the existence of such restrictions.

Sec. 4. In the event the Town Marshal or other

Sec. 2. Other streets and restrictions may be added to this ordinance by the Board from time to time upon resolution adopted at any regular or special meeting.

Sec. 3. The Board may cause appropriate signs indicating such restrictions to be erected so as to inform the public of the existence of such restrictions.

Sec. 4. In the event the Town Marshal or other authorized officer shall find any vehicle parked in such a manner as to obstruct or interfere or hinder traffic or otherwise in violation of this ordinance, such Marshal or other officer is authorize to cause said vehicle to be hauled off the streets and impounded until a reasonable towage charge, but not to exceed Ten Dollars (\$10.00) if paid by the owner or operator thereof.

Sec. 5. Any person violating this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and may be fined in any court of competent jurisdiction in any sum not to exceed Ten Dollars (\$10.00). Provided however, that the Board may prescribe a form of violation ticket notifying the violator of this violation and he may pay a fine of One Dollar (\$1.00) within a period of twenty-four (24) hours to the Town Clerk-Treasurer for the benefit of the General Fund of the Town. Failure to pay such ticket shall subject the violator to the maximum fine herein prescribed.

Sec. 6. In the event any section or part of this Ordinance is held invalid or unconstitutional such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the remainder of the Ordinance.

Sec. 7. Whereas, an emergency exists for the immediate taking effect of the Ordinance, the same shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.



ORDINANCE NO. 1966- 2

An Ordinance of the Town of Fort Branch declaring Junk Yards and Automobile Graveyards within the Corporate Limits of the Town to be a Public Nuisance and providing Penalties for Violation of The Same.

Section 1. BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Fort Branch that in order to protect the public health and comfort of the citizens of the Town of Fort Branch it is hereby declared to be a public nuisance to use or maintain any building, structure, place or tract of real estate as a junk yard or to store or keep on any tract of real estate junk of any kind, including junk motor vehicles.

Section 2. Every person who shall maintain or continue any public nuisance as defined in Section 1 of this Ordinance shall, on conviction be fined not exceeding \$ 100.00 in any court of competent jurisdiction.

Section 3. WHEREAS an emergency exists for the immediate taking effect of this Ordinance, the same shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.
