
A Resolution transferring the following Appropriation amount from said account to specified account.

Fort Branch began as one of a series of forts established along the edge of the western frontier in 1811 to protect the pioneers against raids by roving Indian tribes. This fort, which consisted of two 2-story block houses surrounded by a stockade, was built on the west side of the Red Bank Trail--midway between Vincennes (capital of the Northwest Territory) on the north and the Ohio River on the south.

Its location was selected because of a flowing stream or 'branch' of spring water that assured an adequate supply of water during a siege.
